I had a chance to spend 2 week training at UTH in the framework of the cooperation project between UTH and Cho Ray Hospital. In fact, this oversea training helps me to broaden my knowledge about nursing services. I find that caring process in nursing is quite similar in two hospitals. However, there are some differences in caring services, technological equipment as well.

Firstly, UTH is equipped with modern machinery and caring infrastructure. Therefore, each care bed is received a fully medical function avoiding urgent cases for patients. For example: during postoperative care after heart surgery, the patient is followed up by 2 monitors, 10 to 20 infusion pump are ready to deliver fluids into patient. As a result, new modern technology contributes an enhanced recovery for our patients.

Secondly, documentation and the nurse care planning process are carried out by the continuous and efficient shared understanding of a patient's care history. Thus, UTH assigns workload to staffs by a patient, not up to 2 patients per nurse. Consequently, such process is vital to ensure that the continuity, safety, and quality of care for our patients.

In conclusion, in my point of view, I am really appreciated this training program in many ways. Certainly, I learn how to operate these advanced machines in ICU and PICU, your serious attitude in working. Accordingly, I can use these professional competences in my position.
