It's a good opportunity to visit and study in a very modern hospital as UTH.

Although only 2 weeks time but have changed my mind a lot. My first impression when to UTH is enthusiasm, full of friendly and caring members OPIMA and, especially professor Akiyama and professor Mizutani.

Second: The medical and technical facilities of the ICU and the hospital are very modern than ICU and CR hospital. However, there is no equal in the number of patients. ICU patients in CR more than ICU in UTH. Network management systems in hospitals and electronic medical records for me is extremely excited. I find out this is more useful for clinicians in their work process, such as easily discuss progress pathological changes, consultation and decision about treatment is faster, making patient recovery on time and quickly.

Third: The doctors and their residents have a lot of discussion about the status of each patient under the chairmanship of Professor Chair which has taught the knowledge and experience in clinical practice for young doctors.

The first week, I had the opportunity to observe one case, the patient was 81 years old man who was diagnosed HCC and suspended respiratory-circulatory then cardiopulmonary resuscitation, but were unsuccessful, the patient is then moved to the ICU, followed continue CPR has just installed VA ECMO. ICU doctors perform resuscitation procedures are professional and fast, only takes about 15 minutes. That period was very impressed fast to install ECMO.

At Cho Ray hospital ECMO cases it took us about 1 hour to install ECMO. For reasons such as medical instruments are not available, not coordinated team work well and skills of ICU doctors in the field of ECM was not good.

Through 2 weeks visiting and studying in UTH, I feel a lot of things to learn and improve myself and my team in the future. I hope to use the knowledge that I have learned to develop my ICU.
